Season 2019/20

Indoor hockey played within the BIHL structure is not defined by 'Clubs' but rather by 'Teams' which are formed by groups of individuals that may spread across several outdoor club, representative teams or personal friendships. It's primarily more social and less official that Brisbane field hockey, however it's still competitive and operational rules are in place that need to be observed.

Each team must register a minimum of eight (8) players including a Goal Keeper with a designated team co-ordinator / contact responsible for submitting the Team Nomination Form, collecting / paying the team fees and being liaison with BIHL (as required).

Individuals / Teams may wish to utilise the *Player Advertisements* section on our website to source players / teams.

Senior Competition

The proposed structure of the various divisions each night is outlined below, however it may change depending upon the team nominations. Maximum number of teams is restricted to 66 teams (ie. 28 M & 38 F).

Monday nights

- Division 3, 4 & 5 Woman divisions five (5) teams per division
- Six (6) games scheduled per night from 6 pm through till 10.30 pm
- Fixtures to start 30th September for a 15 week competition + finals

Tuesday nights

- Division 1 Men & Woman divisions six (6) teams per gender
- Six (6) games scheduled per night from 6 pm through till 10.30 pm
- Fixtures to start 1st October for a 10 week + finals pre-Christmas competition
- Players must be a minimum of 16 years old to play in Division 1

Wednesday nights

- Division 2 Men & Woman divisions seven (7) teams per gender
- Six (6) games scheduled per night from 6p m through till 10.30 pm
- Fixtures to start 2nd October for a 14 week competition + finals

Thursday nights

- Division 3, 4 & 5 Men divisions five (5) teams per division
- Six (6) games scheduled per night from 6 pm through till 10.30 pm
- Fixtures to start 3rd October for a 15 week competition + finals

Friday and Sunday nights

- Social mixed indoor from 6 pm
- Division 6 & 7 Woman division five (5) teams each division
- Two (2) games scheduled from 7.30 pm through till 9 pm
- Fixtures to start 4th October for a 10 weeks before Christmas, then move to Tuesday night after Christmas for the remaining 5 weeks + Finals

Junior mixed Competition

- Mixed teams will be graded upon 'team ability' as opposed age or gender into divisions of five (5) teams with games being:-
 - J8 J14 played on 2 court configuration Sunday's
 - J1 J4 played on full court Sunday's from 2 pm
 - o J5, J6 & J7 played on full court Saturday's from 2 pm
- Fixture games to start the weekend of 5th & 6th October 2019
- Season is spread over 17 weeks (12 games, 3 byes & finals)
- Maximum number of teams is restricted to 75 (15 divisions of 5)

General

- All players, officials, parents / guardians & spectators are bound by Hockey Australia Code of Behaviour Policy (refer pages 8 & 9) with Team / Player nomination acceptance at the discretion of BIHL Committee
- FIH Rules of Indoor Hockey apply unless otherwise advised via BIHL Competition Rules & Requirements published on BIHL website,
- O Games to be 2 x 20 min halves (juniors 18 min) with 2 min break / between games
- Players in each team are required to have common playing outfits (socks, shorts/skirts & top) which doesn't clash with other teams in the same division.
 These can be outdoor club uniform, coloured polo / t-shirts etc. Junior teams often express their artistic flare
- No warm-up on court or inside sports the hall outside area / fields can be used
- All teams must have a minimum of eight (8) registered players (6 on court + 2 subs)
 with a maximum of 12 which included a designated fully kitted goalkeeper.
- Players can only be registered in one (1) team within each Competition, substitutions can only come from lower graded division teams or age eligible juniors
- State Open and U21 indoor players, and those in Australian Indoor Squads or High Performance outdoor programs (HA / HQ) can only play in Division 1
- Players age eligibility is:-
 - Junior Competition must be at least 7 years old and under 16 years of age as at the 1st October 2019.
 - Senior Competition (ex Div 1) must be at least 14 years old
 - Division 1 must be at least 16 years old

Note: The BIHL Committee reserves the right to grade teams into any division and has the right to refuse the registration / nomination of any team or player.

Season Fees / Costs

The table below outlines the unchanged season fees (incl. GST) for each competition.

The 'Team Cost' is an 'all up cost' for the team covering all games (fixture & finals), teams will are requested to pay a \$ 200 deposit upon accepted into the competition, with the balance of season fees due in December 2019.

Umpires

- A pool of umpires is required for the coming season, without such team will be called up to umpire games. Nominations will be called closer to the season start, however welcome contact from anyone interested.
- Indoor is seen as an excellent opportunity for new umpires to gain experience without the pressures that may occur in field hockey. Like field hockey, umpires have the opportunity to officiate at State & National titles
- New and junior umpires will have access to monitoring in assisting them grow confidence and experience.
- Umpire payments are \$ 15 (Junior) and \$ 20 (Seniors) per game

Representative Teams

Brisbane Indoor will look to enter two (2) teams into each of the under-age State Indoor Championships, but this will depend upon the level of player nominations, availability of team officials and Hockey Qld rules. The nomination process, selection trials &/or training sessions details will be published via BIHL website (Rep Program) when information becomes available.

State Indoor Championships - conducted by Hockey Qld to enable selection of state teams to complete in National Indoor Championships. Refer www.hockeyqld.com.au

Junior Development Clinics

During the September school holidays coaching clinics are proposed - details will be released via our website.

All persons participating in Brisbane Indoor Hockey League must meet the following requirements in regard to your conduct and in any role you hold within the sport of hockey.

Player / Team Officials Code of Behaviour

- 1. Behave in a sporting manner at all times to all players, officials and spectators.
- 2. Don't make detrimental statements in respect of the performance of any match officials or umpires.
- 3. Play by the rules at all times and ensure that the game of hockey is not brought into disrepute by your actions.
- 4. Do not engage in inappropriate and/or physical contact with players or officials during the course of play.
- 5. Accept responsibility for all actions taken. Exercise reasonable care to prevent injury by ensuring that you play within the rules. Reasonable care consists of showing due diligence in abiding by the rules and adhering to the officials decisions.
- 6. Adhere to the Anti-Doping Policy advocated by Hockey Australia.
- 7. Do not bet on the outcome or on any other aspect of a hockey match or competition.
- 8. Do not try to achieve a contrived outcome to a match or competition, or otherwise improperly influence the outcome or any other aspect of a match or a competition.
- 9. Do not show unnecessary obvious dissension, displeasure or disapproval (by action or verbal abuse) towards an umpire or match official as a consequence of his or her decision or generally.
- 10. Abstain from the use of tobacco and the consumption of alcoholic beverages while in the playing/representative uniform.
- 11. Adhere to Hockey Australia racial and sexual vilification policy.
- 12. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- 13. Don't do anything which adversely affects or reflects on or discredits the game of hockey, Hockey Australia or any affiliated association, or any squad, team, competition, tournament, sponsor, official supplier or licensee, including, but not limited to, any illegal act or any act of dishonesty or fraud.
- 14. Refrain from using obscene, offensive or insulting language and/or making obscene gestures which may insult other players, officials or spectators.
- 15. The Tournament Director and/or Event Coordinator are responsible for ensuring that the Code of Conduct is met at all times.

Parent / Guardian Code of Behaviour

- 1. Parents/Guardians shall at all times conform to accepted standards of good sportsmanship and behaviour.
- 2. Parents/Guardians shall at all times respect officials, coaches and players and extend all courtesies to them.
- 3. Lead by example and respect all players, coaches, umpires and spectators physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated.
- 4. Respect the umpires' decision. Do not abuse, threaten or intimidate an umpire or match official and do not show dissension, displeasure or disapproval towards an umpire or match official's decision in an abusive or unreasonable fashion.
- 5. Never publicly criticise umpires raise personal concerns with competition / association officials in private.
- 6. Support skilled performances.
- 7. Show respect for opponents.
- 8. Display appropriate social behaviour by not using profane, demeaning or derogatory language, or harassing players, coaches, officials or other spectators.
- 9. Do not throw any object.

- 10. Barrack in a positive way.
- 11. Leave the area tidy and free from litter or other mess.
- 12. Remember that you are there for the participants to enjoy the game.
- 13. Never ridicule mistakes or losses.
- 14. Recognise all volunteers who are giving up their valuable time.
- 15. The umpire may issue a warning to the team captain, of the spectators which are breaking the code of behaviour, to let the spectators know that their team will lose points if they continue to behave in a manner not in-line with the code of behaviour.
- 16. Refrain from any form of personal abuse towards your children and team-mates. This includes verbal, physical and emotional abuse. Be alert to any forms of abuse directed towards you children and team-mates from other sources whilst they are in your care.
- 17. Refrain from any form of harassment towards your athletes. This includes sexual and racial harassment, racial vilification and harassment on the grounds of disability.
- 18. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- 19. Be a positive role model for your children.


- 1) **Release and Indemnity:** In consideration of the competition / association accepting my nomination I, to the extent permitted by law:
